The intent of the agreement is to facilitate the smooth transfer and transition of graduates from Hudson County Community College's A.A.S. program into Montclair State University's B.S. program. The successful implementation of the Agreement depends on the communication of its contents to all involved participants, and the assumption of responsibility by both institutions for such communication.

This agreement permits the completion of a Bachelor's degree in the approved transfer Program or other program as identified in this Agreement.

This agreement is in full compliance with the State's Full Faith and Credit Policy and the Transfer Advisory Board's interpretive statement of that policy.

Programmatic changes by either institution will necessitate amendments to this agreement as appropriate in writing signed by authorized representatives of both parties.

This Agreement will take effect for Fall term 2018 and will be applicable only to all transfer students entering Montclair State University for the first time in Fall 2018 or thereafter and who have earned an A.A.S. degree from HCCC in January 2018 or thereafter. Further, the Agreement applies only to students from HCCC that conform to the provisions of this Agreement.

This transfer Articulation Agreement applies to students graduating from Hudson County Community College with an A.A.S. Degree in the following program:

Culinary Arts

And who are accepted by Montclair State University for admission into the following B.S. degree program in its College of Education & Human Services:

Nutrition & Food Science - Food Systems

The parties agree to the following conditions, equivalencies and other terms that have been identified by the two institutions participating in this agreement.

- 1. Under this transfer agreement between Montclair State University and Hudson County Community College:
 - a. The Montclair State University Application fee is waived.
 - b. Montclair State University will accept no more than 69 transfer credits for courses earned at HCCC toward courses required by the University as indicated in worksheet below.
 - c. Criteria for admission to the University and /or to the specific upper level program requires demonstration of the following:
 - i). Transfer students to be covered by this agreement are eligible for admission to Montclair State University upon completion of the A.A.S degree with a minimum grade point average of 2.75 for the above listed program covered by this agreement. Applicants with a lower than 2.75 GPA will be considered on a case-by-case basis.
 - ii) Satisfaction of all admission requirements applicable to all other students are met.

B. SELF – INSURANCE BY MSU - MSU is an agency of the State of New Jersey. Any agreement or arrangement signed or entered into on behalf of the State of New Jersey by a State official or employee shall be subject to all of the provisions of the New Jersey Torts Claims Act, NJSA 59:1-1 et seq., the New Jersey Contractual Liability Act, NJSA 59:13:1, et seq., and the availability of appropriations. The State of New Jersey does not carry public liability insurance, but the liability of the State and the obligations of the State to be responsible for tort claims against its agencies

and employees is covered under the terms and provisions of the State of New Jersey Tort Claims Act. The Act also creates a special self – insurance fund and provides for payment and claims against the State of New Jersey against its employees for which the State of New Jersey is obligated to indemnify against tort claims which arise out of the performance of their duties. Claims against University or its employees should be referred for handling to the Attorney General, Division of Law, Claims Services section, Richard Hughes Complex, Trenton, New Jersey 08625. Furthermore, the State of New Jersey self – funds for Workers Compensation and Disability.

- C. ANTI DISCRIMINATION The parties agree not to discriminate in employment and agree to abide by all anti- discrimination laws including those contained within N.J.S.A. 10:2-4, N.J.S.A. 10:5-1 et seq. and N.J.S.A. 10:5-31 through 10:5-38, and all rules and regulations issued there under.
- D. AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT The parties agree to comply with all provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) P.L. 101-336, in accordance with 42 U.S.C. 12101 et seq. 1 4
- E. **COMPLIANCE LAWS** The parties shall comply with all local state and federal laws, rules and regulations applicable to the contract.
- F. **SUBCONTRACTING OR ASSIGNMENT** The Agreement may not be subcontracted or assigned in whole or part, without prior written consent, if granted shall not relieve either party of any of its responsibilities under the contract.
- G. MAINTENACE OF RECORDS The parties shall maintain records associated with the performance of this contract in accordance with the applicable provisions of the NJ State Retention Policy. Such Records shall be made available to either party upon request for purposes of conducting and audit or for ascertaining other information.
- H. STUDENT APPEAL PROCESS. Montclair State University shall provide a procedure through which a transfer student can appeal a decision that he/she believes is not consistent with this Agreement. The procedure shall be published in the University's catalog, student handbook, and website. A student who wishes to appeal a decision must file that appeal with the University. Such appeal must be submitted by the student within 30 days of receiving the decision in question. The University will provide a decision to the student within 60 days of receipt of the appeal. The decision of the University is final. HCCC will be informed of the nature of the appeal and the decision by the baccalaureate institution.

I. INSTITUTIONAL RESOLUTION OF DISPUTES REGARDING THE AGREEMENT.

1. If HCCC believes the decision of the University was not consistent with this Agreement, HCCC shall consult with the University and seek to achieve resolution of the matter. If HCCC cannot achieve resolution of the matter with the University, HCCC may submit the matter for consideration and recommendation to the Special Transfer Agreement Panel established by the Presidents' Council, as set forth below. The Panel shall receive relevant documentation and opinions from the University and HCCC, and, if so requested, they shall provide timely response to any additional requests for information from the Panel. The Panel shall make any recommendations in the matter which it deems advisable. Those recommendations shall be forwarded to the institutions concerned and to the Transfer Committee. The Transfer Committee shall report on any Panel recommendations to the Presidents' Council.

2. A Special Transfer Agreement Panel comprised of three persons and three alternates shall be appointed to serve each year by the Presidents' Council. One member and alternate of the Panel shall be former academic officers nominated by the University; one member and alternate of the Panel shall be former academic officers nominated by HCCC; and one member and alternate of the Panel shall be nominated by the Commission on Higher Education. The alternate member shall serve whenever the regular member is unavailable or has a current or prior affiliation with one of the institutions involved in the dispute. The costs of the dispute resolution process shall be borne equally by the University and HCCC involved in the appeal.

The foregoing terms and conditions are agreed to and accepted by the parties by affixing their signature below. This Agreement may be signed in counterparts and shall be enforceable by facsimile or original signature
