  - Student teaching in professional setting Senior year

# Family Life Education Certification: CFLE (provisional)

# Only works with Family Service concentration

- Requires 7 additional courses; BUT be crafty (or go to a crafty advisor)!!
  - Use 3 FSHD electives for these courses
  - Use 3 Elective collaterals for these course
  - This leaves only 1 additional course
- Must earn C- or better in every major course
- Student submits Application, Fee, and transcripts to NCFR

# Do I need to complete a minor?

## NO

- Montclair does not require a Minor for graduation
- Family Science and Human Development does not require a Minor for graduation
- Employers do not require a Minor; most just want to see your GPA
- A Minor may delay graduation! Especially Teacher ed track students

## YES

- Graduate schools may require certain courses AND a minor will help you obtain them
  - Speech Pathology
  - Family Law
