** If you transferred into MSU with an AA or an AS degree from a NJ community college, your Gen Ed requirements should have been waived. If you transferred in with an AAS degree from a NJ community college or with coursework from another institution of higher education, your transfer courses were assessed on a course-by-course basis. (Whether or not a transfer course is an adequate substitute for a Montclair State University course will be determined by each department).*

*** If you are a transfer or second Bachelor's student for whom General Education requirements have been waived, you are still required to fulfill the World Languages and Cultures Requirement.*

****Students wishing to continue a language with which they have some prior experience, either academic or personal, must take a placement test. If they place at the 2nd semester level, they must take 6 semester hours (two sequential world language courses) to fulfill the requirement. If they place at the third semester level or higher, they must take only 3 semester hours (one world language course) at the level at which they place OR a course in English about a foreign culture or civilization. Students who are fluent in another language who can pass a language proficiency exam at the NYU School of Continuing Education (brochures are available in the Center for Advising and Student Transitions in Webster Hall) will not have to fulfill the World Languages requirement.*
