








- Faculty and students presenting at the prestigious research conference in NYC

Overview



Students who have been admitted to MSU with Conditional Admission to Teacher Education will complete Program requirements

[https://www.montclair.edu/admissions/conditional-admission/] and will formally apply to the Program second semester sophomore year for full admission.



Students admitted to Montclair State University are eligible to apply to the Teacher Education Program their second year.



In their first 3 semesters, students prepare to apply to the program by:

- Completing pre-requisite teaching courses
- Taking courses for their major
- Meeting exam requirements SAT, ACT or Praxis Core

Students meet with their Teacher Education Program advisors to map out their program



Program Options

Combined Bachelor's/Master's Program with Dual Certification in Teaching Students with Disabilities

Early Childhood (P-3), Elementary (K-6), or Secondary Education (P-12)

An accelerated five-year track that will earn you a Bachelor's and Master of Arts in Teaching degrees and teacher certifications in a content area and Teacher of Students with Disabilities (inclusive education).

Early Childhood (Preschool – Grade 3)

Learn about early childhood development, curriculum design and instructional practices appropriate for preschool grades. Students earn a bachelor's degree and a certification in teaching grades P-3.

Elementary (Kindergarten – Grade 6)

Learn about childhood development, elementary curriculum design and instructional practices appropriate for elementary school grades. Students earn a bachelor's degree and a certification in teaching grades K-6.

Secondary (Preschool – Grade 12)

Learn about how to teach content areas such as English, Science, Math, and World Languages in middle and high schools as well as specialty areas (Art, Music, Physical Education) in P-12 settings. Students earn a bachelor's degree and a certification in teaching grades P-12.




Exploring beyond

CLINICAL EXPERIENCES


- In order for students to understand the demands of teaching in a classroom setting, we believe it is important for them to have clinical experiences early and often.
- Our expanding network of 30 school district partners provides students with a wealth of opportunities for hands-on experiences.
- Students begin their internship experiences before they begin the program.

POSSIBLE DEGREE OUTCOMES

Students select a major, which they work on concurrently with their teaching certification.

- Students either graduate with:
 - a bachelor's in their major and teacher certification(s)
 - or a bachelor's, master of arts in teaching, and certifications in a content area and special education
- Students may add an additional certification in Teaching English as a Second Language (TESL).

Mathematics Degree with Elementary (K-6) Teaching Certification

Receive \$13,000 per year for two years!

Juniors or seniors majoring in math and seeking elementary teacher certification with a 3.0 or better GPA can apply!

*Academic support for advanced math courses

*Research experience

*Support after graduation and into first year of teaching

Noyce scholars must complete two years of teaching in a high need school district for each year of support
