This is not to say that retributive action has been, or can be, eliminated from disciplinary decision making. On occasion, it is expected that a person will choose to disregard the expected standards and published regulations. In such instances, the disciplinary problem may be resolved only by removing the individual from the College, either for a specific period of time, or in some cases, permanently.

SECTION II. OVERVIEW





































































































Distinguished Guests and Friends:

It is my special privilege to welcome you—on behalf of the Senior Class—to our commencement.

There is always an element of uncertainty when speaking for someone else, and that seems especially true right now. In attempting to define and express the individual thoughts of the members of such a diverse group, it is much easier to see the differences than to find the similarities. We do not speak with one voice. Each of us has come from a different environment, has had individual life experiences, has faced private sorrow, and has experienced personal joy.

But our purpose today is to celebrate together what we have shared together. "No love, no friendship," wrote Francois Mauriac, "can cross the path of our destiny without leaving some mark." What we have shared together at Bloomfield College is not only our pursuit of education, but also our potential for friendship, and the recognition of our common humanity.

Each of us has been encouraged, within our separate disciplines, to "think like a nurse," to "think like an historian," to "think like an accountant." While this approach is useful, and maybe necessary, in creating a sense of community within our prospective professions, it seems at least as necessary for each graduate to consciously think of himself as a human being. In our "humanness," after all, is rooted our real potential for cooperative effort. Not every human being needs to be a "scholar," of course, in order to live a worthwhile life. But surely every worthwhile "scholar" needs to become conscious of his humanity, if he hopes to derive a sense of achievement from his work, and to create a sense of happiness for himself, within his family, and among his friends.

If we are serious, it is never easy to invite friendship, or to love someone. We risk pain when we reach out to another person. He may reject us. But the recognition of our own humanity—and his, and the understanding of another's needs—and ours, make it possible, even essential, to risk the pain rather than miss the joy of human relationships. If philosophical religious acceptance requires the "leap of faith," real human friendship demands the "leap of trust." Each of us, entering a new relationship, echoes the poet: "I have spread my dreams under your feet; tread softly, for you tread upon my dreams."

But even as we celebrate our potential for friendship, and what we have shared together, none of us is unrealistic enough to deny our very real differences. Above all, there is a very great need for reality. In 1947, before most of the members of this graduating class were born, Henry Stimson, a political man, articulated a thought which each of us might consider within the politics of our own lives: "We are forced," he said, "to act in the world as it is, and not in the world as we wish it were, or as we would like it to become."

Among the members of this graduating class—among all the members of this College Community—diversity is still the outstanding common characteristic. But that reality, once accepted, can become a source of strength. The solution may rest in the ability to channel this diversity, to capitalize on it, and to use its force to effect meaningful, careful, and useful programs. We must not see ourselves as fragmented, alienated, isolated individuals—neither understood, nor understanding—but rather begin to see ourselves as joint members of the same community, having different talents, but the common good will, to use this diversity to achieve our essential goals.

If our education at Bloomfield College has given us insight into ourselves as human beings, confidence to direct our own lives, and the warmth to reach out to others, then it has been a success. But neither its success, nor ours, can be measured today; for today, after all, is a commencement, and we have come together to celebrate a beginning. As a class, it gives us great joy that you have come to celebrate with us.
