GAME NOTES

The Game

♦ The Red Hawks look to go 2-0 for the second straight season as they hit the road for the first time in 2008 taking Morrisville State.

The Series

♦ One of the two newcomers to the New Jersey Athletic Conference this season (the other being the College at Brockport), Morrisville State will be a new opponent for the Red Hawks as the teams square off for the first time. This is the third season as a member of Division III for the Mustangs, who made the transition from the junior college ranks in 2006. (See series record on page 4).

Last Time Out

♦ The Red Hawks opened their season with a win for the third consecutive year as they knocked off Wilkes, 13-6 at Sprague Field last week. Despite being behind in nearly every statistical category, MSU led in the one that counted most as it came up with big plays when it needed to. Junior running back **Jeff Bliss (New Milford, NJ / New Milford)** rushed for 85 yards and a pair of touchdowns while freshman quarterback **Tom Fischer (Livingston, NJ / Livingston)** was quite efficient in this collegiate debut as he was 11-of-12 through the air for 129 yards. Montclair would strike first as a bad snap on a punt in the second quarter gave the Red Hawks great field position. After a Fischer completion, Bliss raced 24 yards up the middle virtually untouched to give MSU a 7-0 lead. Wilkes would cut the deficit to a 7-6 in the third quarter, however on Montclair's first play following the Colonels' field goal, Fischer hit **Jeff Papcun (Hazlet, NJ / Raritan)** on a 73-yard one-handed, over-the-shoulder grab down to the Wilkes 2. On the next play, Bliss barreled in for his second touchdown as MSU extended its lead to 13-6 with 9:37 left in the third quarter. The rest was left up to the Montclair State defense, which thwarted several Wilkes drives. Sophomore safety **Mario McLean (Montville, NJ / Montville)** intercepted a pass at the goal line to end one drive and **Shawn Gibson (Hillside, NJ / Hillside)** had another. In the fourth quarter, Wilkes went on a mammoth 17-play, 73-yard drive that chewed up nearly nine minutes. But on a key third-down at the MSU 20, linebacker **Cornell Hunt (North Brunswick, NJ / North Brunswick)** stopped a would-be first down run for no gain and the Colonels misfired on fourth down as the Red Hawks ran out the remainder of the clock for the victory. Hunt finished with 12 tackles in the game while linebacker **Dan Krainski (Sayreville, NJ / Sayreville)** added 10.

Montclair State vs. SUNY Morrisville - Game Notes (9/20/08)

RICK GIANCOLA Head Coach 26th Season



- Rick Giancola is in his 26th season as a head coach. He was named the 12th head coach in Montclair State history in July, 1983. It was his first head coaching position.
- Giancola is the all-time winningest coach in MSU history with 173 wins. He reached took over the top spot in September 1989 against Ramapo. Giancola surpassed Fred Hill for the mark.
- Giancola has led Montclair State to eight of its conference record 17 NJAC Championships. Giancola won four straight from 1983-86, and added titles in 1989, 1999, 2000 and 2003.
- Giancola's teams have made seven NCAA Division III Playoff appearances (1985-86, 1989, 1999-2001, 2003). Four times, the Red Hawks reached the quarterfinal round.
- Giancola enters the 2008 season ranked 26th among active Division III coaches in winning percentage, and is sixth in victories.
- Giancola became just the second collegiate football coach in New Jersey State history to win 150 games as Montclair downed Frostburg State in 2002. Giancola joined TCNJ's Eric Hamilton as the only two coaches to reach that plateau. In 2007, Giancola joined Hamilton again as the only coaches in NJAC Football history to record 100 conference victories.
- Giancola has been named the NJAC Coach of the Year five times, including the 1999, 2000 and 2003 seasons.
- Giancola has guided Montclair State to two long winning streaks in the NJAC during his tenure. He posted 18 straight NJAC wins from 1984-86 and had a 16-game win streak from 1999 until the final game of the 2001 season.
- He has had 18 players named to NCAA Division III All-American Teams. He has also seen 15 players sign professional contracts.
- Giancola graduated from Glassboro State (now Rowan) in 1968 with a degree in Education. He played both football and baseball for the Profs. He was an All-East selection at tight end and was inducted into the school's Hall of Fame in 1991.

On the Road Again

- The game with Morrisville marks the first road contest for the Red Hawks this season. Last year, Montclair was 3-2 away from home. Over the past several seasons the road has been kind to Montclair as the Red Hawks have posted a 32-15 (.680) mark away from Sprague Field since 1999.

Going For 2 (and 0)

- Montclair State, now 43-30-5 in season openers, will attempt to begin a season at 2-0 for the 28th time. MSU began last season at 2-0 and has done it now nine times under Rick Giancola. Montclair State's other 2-0 starts - 1931, 1934, 1938 1942, 1947, 1952, 1953, 1960, 1961, 1963, 1964, 1966, 1970, 1974, 1978, 1979, 1981, 1982, 1986, 1988, 1990, 1993, 1998, 1999, 2001, 2004 and 2007).

Cybert Earns NJAC Special Teams POTW Honors

- When the Red Hawks lost punter Michael Lajterman to graduation, it didn't need to look far for his replacement. Junior **Troy Cybert (Hillsborough, NJ / Hillsborough)** filled the void very quickly on Saturday and his efforts earned him Special Teams Player of the Week honors from the NJAC. Cybert averaged 44.8 yards per punt in his four attempts, breaking the single-game average set by Lajterman last season. On his final attempt of the day, he delivered a 50-yard punt which pinned Wilkes inside of their own 20-yard line late in the fourth quarter to help preserve the victory. Cybert currently leads the NJAC in punting. The performance should come as no surprise to anyone. Two years ago, Cybert averaged 3.61 yards per kick en route to earning Honorable Mention All-NJAC honors.

Fischer Garners NJAC Offensive Rookie Weekly Honors

- Cybert was the only one to collect accolades from the NJAC this past week. Freshman quarterback **Tom Fischer (Livingston, NJ / Livingston)** was named the league's Offensive Rookie of the Week. Fischer becomes the first MSU player to earn Offensive Rookie honors since **Jeff Bliss (New Milford, NJ / New Milford)** captured the honor on November 4, 2006. Fischer had an outstanding first game as he went 11-of-12 for 129 yards in the win over Wilkes. Fischer hit on his first eight passes and set and MSU single-game record with a 91.7 completion percentage (minimum of 10 attempts). Among his 11 completions was a 73-yard strike that helped set up Montclair's second touchdown. Fischer was a standout at Livingston High School and was a walk-on at Rutgers last season before transferring to MSU in the Spring where he practiced with the Red Hawks. He is currently second in the NJAC in pass efficiency with a 182.0 rating.

Tackling His Way Up the Chart

- It didn't take long for senior linebacker **Cornell Hunt (North Brunswick, NJ / North Brunswick)** to pick up where he left off last season. Compiling one of the top single-season tackle totals in 2007, Hunt made a team-high 12 in the win versus Wilkes while also recording one for a loss and a pass breakup. It marked the 10th time in the last 12 games, and 16th in the previous 22 contests that Hunt has recorded 10 or more stops in a game. Of the 12 he made on Saturday, none were bigger than his tackle on a 3rd-and-3 late in the game with Wilkes driving for a potential tying touchdown. Hunt raced through the line and dragged down the ball carrier for no gain setting up a fourth down which Wilkes could not convert. MSU regained possession and ran out the clock for the win. The NJAC leader in tackles the past two seasons, Hunt sits atop the category this year as well. His 12 tackles gave him 279 for his career which jumped him from 11th to seventh on the all-time MSU list.

Time Not on Their Side

- It certainly wasn't for Montclair State in its victory over Wilkes. The Red Hawks possessed the ball for just 21:59 of the game as the Colonels ran off 75 plays compared to 35 for the Red Hawks. Last season, MSU was ranked fifth in the NJAC in time of possession as it has won the TOP battle only five times in 12 games dating back to the beginning of the 2007 campaign. Despite holding the ball less than its opponents in those contests, Montclair has won five of the last six games and over the two-plus years MSU is 9-4 when it doesn't control the clock perhaps proving that it's not the quantity of possession that matters most, it's the quality.

Dan Krainski (Sayreville, NJ / Sayreville), it sure was great to be back on the playing field. McGrady, an All-NJAC selection in 2006, returned to the secondary after missing all of last season. He posted just one tackle, but had two pass breakups. Krainski was supposed to be one of 23 seniors to graduate last season, however he was granted another year of eligibility and he made the most of it in his first game with a career-best 10 tackles, including eight unassisted.

Secondary Help

It was talked about last week as the most experience of units within the Red Hawks roster and it certainly showed it in the victory over Wilkes. The MSU secondary came up with some big plays in the 13-6 victory. In addition to McGrady's two pass breakups, senior **Shawn Gibson (Hillside, NJ / Hillside)** had an interception along with three tackles. Sophomore **Mario McLean (Montville, NJ / Montville)** collected five tackles and picked off a pass at the goal line to end a Wilkes drive in the fourth quarter. Junior **Jesse Shenker (Freehold, NJ / Freehold)** had six tackles in the game and junior **Dominique Dixon (Wharton, NJ / Morris Hills)** had four tackles and a fumble recovery and return that thwarted a Wilkes scoring drive in the first quarter.

Hawk Feed

Bliss had another solid day running the ball for the Red Hawks as he accounted for both touchdowns while finishing with 85 yards on 16 carries. The junior, who served primarily as a backup to Ryan McCoach the past two years, surpassed the 600 yard mark in his career, which includes 10 touchdowns total (nine rushing). Bliss is averaging 4.6 yards per carry in his career (135 attempts, 628 yards). If you were to factor in his kickoff return numbers (18 for 429 yards), Bliss is averaging 6.9 yards every time he's touched the ball.

Senior tight end **Jeremy Mercer (Leonardo, NJ / Middletown South)**, had three catches for 26 yards against Wilkes. That's nearly half the total number of receptions he had a year ago when he earned All-NJAC honors. Mercer finished 2007 with seven catches, three of which went for touchdowns.

Offensive linemen **Michael Goff (Monroe, NJ / Monroe)** and **Jason Wombough (Keansburg, NJ / Keansburg)** have been mainstays on the offensive line for each of past three seasons. This week, Goff will make his 27th straight start a center, a position he took over in the seventh game of the 2005 campaign. Wombough will start his 22nd consecutive contest at right tackle. Wombough took over the spot at the beginning of the 2006 season.

Meet the Captains

Last February the Red Hawks announced their captains for the 2007 season - **Cornell Hunt (North Brunswick, NJ / North Brunswick)**, **Nick Giangrande (Belleville, NJ / Belleville)**, **Jeremy Mercer (Leonardo, NJ / Middletown South)**, **A.J. Letizia (Dumont, NJ / Dumont)** and **Jason Scott (Bayville, NJ / Central Regional)**. Hunt, whose exploits have been well documented, returns as team captain for a second straight year. Giangrande started all 11 games at defensive end in 2007 collecting 34 tackles and was second on the team in sacks with 4.5 while totaling eight for losses and a forced fumble. Mercer is back for his third season as the starting tight end. A standout on special teams (school-record 10 blocked kicks in '07), Mercer was named All-NJAC and All-ECAC as he had seven catches on the year with three going for touchdowns. Letizia garnered All-NJAC honors in '07 after finishing fifth in the NJAC in receptions with 38 and third in total yards with 798 while also collecting four touchdown catches. Scott made a couple of starts during the year at fullback and was a contributor on special teams. He had five receptions while also providing the tailbacks with solid blocking.

New Look NJAC...

Today's contest with Morrisville begins the run of nine straight NJAC contests to end the season. Morrisville, a former junior college now in its third Division III campaign, joined the College at Brockport as the conference became a 10-team league for the 2008 season. The NJAC will once again have an automatic bid to the NCAA Division III Playoffs.

SCOUTING THE MUSTANGS

- ◆ One of the two newcomers to the New Jersey Athletic Conference this season, Morrisville is 0-1 overall and in the league after suffering a 51-37 loss to Cortland on September 6.
- ◆ The Mustangs racked up 505 yards of total offense against the Red Dragons and led 20-16 in the second quarter before Cortland scored three times bridging the first and second half.
- ◆ Quarterback **Billy Poling** had an outstanding day as he not only completed 23-of-31 for 344 yards and a touchdown, but he also added 68 yards and three touchdowns on the ground. **Eddie Hull** had 10 receptions for 158 yards while **Wendall Williams** collected five for 123 yards and a touchdown.
- ◆ Defensively, **Anthony Brown** led the Morrisville defense with 10 tackles while **EJ Maeweather** collected seven.
- ◆ Head coach **Terry Dow** is in his 12th season at Morrisville State. In 11 seasons with the Mustangs, Dow has compiled an overall record of 62 wins and 50 losses, claiming three National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) Northeast Football Conference championships and two Region III championships.

- ◆ In 2002, Dow coached the Mustangs to a 9-2 overall record, the most wins at Morrisville State, and an undefeated conference record of 5-0 claiming the school's second conference championship in three seasons. That same year, Morrisville State took the Region III championship title and Dow was named the Northeast Football Conference Coach of the Year.
- ◆ A 1990 graduate of Ithaca College with a bachelor of science in physical education, Dow spent two seasons as a lineman under legendary head coach, Jim Butterfield, before remaining at Ithaca for three additional years, beginning his coaching career as assistant coach for the offensive and defensive lines.
- ◆ In 1991, Dow joined the football coaching staff at Colgate University as coach of the tight ends for the Raiders before accepting a coaching position at Monmouth University in New Jersey. Named offensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator in 1993 at Monmouth, a Division I-AA football program, Dow spent four seasons with the Hawks.
- ◆ For six years, Dow served as the president of the NFC Coaches' Association and was the District I representative to the NJCAA for football. He is a member of the American Football Coaches Association and was instrumental in having Morrisville State College become a member institute of the New York State High School Coaches Football Association.
