#### SECONDARY(P-12):

- SASE 210
- EDFD 200 or PSYC 200 or FSHD 216
- 9-11 CREDITS OF MAJOR COURSEWORK\*

**\*MATH MAJORS MUST COMPLETE 11 CREDITS INCLUDING CALCULUS I AND II AND MTHM 201 OR A COURSE THAT REQUIRES CALCULUS II AS A PREREQUISITE.**

#### TRANSFER STUDENTS:

- Eligible to apply IF they have 60 or more credits AND they:
- completed 9-11 credits of major coursework
  - completed or are enrolled in SASE 210
  - completed or are enrolled in EDFD 200 or approved equivalent
  - A.A. or A.S. degree from a NJ two-year institution are waived from taking EDFD 220 (and EDFD 221)
