Master of Science in Exercise Science and Sport Studies Concentration in Sport Administration



Program Description

Graduate students can now engage in advanced study in the general field of exercise science and sport studies, and enhance their proficiency in sport administration. The concentration is designed to cultivate the knowledge and skills needed to work in various facets of the sport industry.

Students will benefit from a strong core in Sport Administration, with options to take additional coursework in Athletic Administration (for those seeking the Supervisory Certificate), Coaching, and Sport Business. An internship or research project is the program's culminating experience. Graduates can pursue careers as directors of athletics in interscholastic sport, coaches, or managers for professional teams (sales, marketing, facilities, event coordinator, guest relations), or even take on additional, advanced graduate study.

Classes are typically held in the evening. Many courses are offered in a hybrid format in which some of the class meetings take place in the classroom while the remaining class sessions are conducted online. In-person class sessions are held in fully mediated classrooms in University Hall.

Admission Requirements

All applicants must meet the basic admission requirements for graduate study at Montclair State University. There are no prerequisites for the Sport Administration concentration.

Applications are reviewed on a rolling admission basis with interested candidates submitting an online application, statement of objectives (essay), undergraduate transcripts, two letters of recommendation, and application fee. Completion of the GRE is not required for this program.
