POSITION DESCRIPTION AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

The School of Music and Dance is seeking a tenure-track faculty member at the rank of Assistant Professor for a Fall 2020 appointment. The successful candidate will teach courses in composition, theory, orchestration, and counterpoint and will mentor B.M. and M.M. composition students through private instruction. While the candidate will not serve as coordinator of the composition area upon hire, such responsibilities may be assigned in the future. The candidate will be encouraged to contribute to collaborative relationships across the School of Music and Dance, to cultivate and maintain active connections with theory and composition instructors in the region, and to participate in the recruitment and retention of outstanding students. Active and sustained involvement in professional growth (i.e., scholarship and creative activities) beyond the university is required to obtain tenure and promotion, as are excellence in teaching and participation in faculty governance.

QUALIFICATIONS:

Applicants must have earned a terminal degree in composition (Ph.D. or D.MA.) or the equivalent in professional experience by the appointment date. The successful candidate must be a proven pedagogue of composition within both private studio and classroom settings and should possess excellent interpersonal skills for working with a diverse student population and a dynamic faculty. The preferred candidate must demonstrate artistic and pedagogical versatility across a broad range of styles, which may include: classical, popular (including vernacular music in film and video games), jazz, and world musics. The candidate must show evidence of an ongoing commitment to advancing the profession through appropriate activities, including commissioned works, audio recordings, publications, performances, and the promotion of new music. Evidence of commitment to university and community collaborations is strongly desired.

RANK AND SALARY:

Appointment will be at the rank of Assistant Professor with salary commensurate with qualifications and experience.
