The 42-credit Master of Public Health program at Montclair State University prepares culturally and professionally competent leaders in community health education by providing an interdisciplinary academic and experiential program with a focus on social justice.

The program offers a fall start date only, and has the following deadlines. After the deadline applications will be reviewed on a space-available basis:

- Early action December 15th (Decision by January 29th)
- Regular March 15th

Concentrations Include

- Community health education aims to prepare public health professionals to protect and enhance the health and well-being of populations through health promotion and disease prevention initiatives.
- Health systems administration and policy aims to prepare
 public health professionals with strategic skills for the
 management and administration of hospitals and
 healthcare systems with a focus on prevention and in
 service of social justice and health equity
