## Requirements:

- Open to all students, sophomores and above, any major.
- No teaching experience necessary.
- Identify a human rights topic that matters to you.
- Accepted interns must take EDFD 445 Human Rights Education, Mon. & Wed. 12:00-1:25pm. You will earn 3 credits for the internship.

Sample topics: Black Lives Matter, disability rights, antisemitism, environmental justice, Native American justice, Latinx history, DACA & Dreamers, reproductive health care, mental health disparities, housing or food insecurity, educational equality, LGBTQ+ rights, AAPI history, juvenile justice, mass incarceration, religious freedom...
