CAROL BLAZEJOWSKI

Associate Vice President for University Advancement
B.S. Montclair State University

MS. BLAZEJOWSKI is best known as a trailblazing women's basketball player who served as captain of the U.S. Women's Olympic basketball team and was later inducted into the National Basketball Hall of Fame. She spent 14 years as President and General Manager of the Women's National Basketball Association's New York Liberty, building one of the premier franchises in the WNBA. The NY Liberty had ten playoff appearances, three Eastern Conference Championships, and four appearances in the WNBA Finals. She also served as NBA director of women's basketball programs and director of licensing. Ms. Blazejowski is a member of the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame as well as the Montclair State University Hall of Fame, selected as a three-time All-American (1976, 1977 and 1978) during her years at Montclair State. Her 52-point scoring spree against Queens College in 1977 still stands as Madison Square Garden's all-time collegiate scoring record for both men and women.

MS. BOYLE has extensive experience in a range of areas, including development, fund raising management, public affairs, communications and constituent relations. She also has an impressive track record of success in fund raising projects, as well as in development and special event programs. Before that, she was Executive Director and Vice President of Development at Holy Name Hospital. She also has held senior executive positions at the Hackensack University Medical Center Foundation, the Foundation for the National Institutes of Health, and Meridian Health System. Ms. Boyle began her career at Manhattanville College before taking senior development positions at Iona College and, later, at Bloomfield College.
