Affiliated Leadership Development Opportunities

MSU L.E.A.D.

(Leadership Education and Development)

MSU L.E.A.D is a student organization whose goals are to provide leadership opportunities through community building (networking) on and off campus, and to develop leadership skills through, and to have a commitment to, leadership and effective citizenship.

Emerging Leaders Learning Community (ELLC)

The ELLC program is a curricular and co-curricular learning community for first-year students at MSU. The ELLC is committed to the development of student leaders, and has produced numerous successful student leaders who lead clubs, organizations, fraternities, and sororities; are involved in community service; excel in athletics, and excel academically.

Center for Student Involvement (CSI)

The Center for Student Involvement develops and implements co-curricular programs, events, and initiatives for students. CSI also works with student clubs, organizations, sororities, fraternities, and the Student Government Association in their programming and leadership endeavors.

Center for Career Services and Community-based Learning

The Center for Career Services and Community-based Learning provides students with the opportunity to advance both their careers and civic development. The Center helps students focus their interests, explore majors, apply classroom learning to the workplace, and attain the knowledge, skills, and motivation to be productive and engaged citizens.

MSU Bonner Leader Program

The Bonner Leader Program identifies and trains a cohesive team of students to serve the local community through community service partnerships, while earning money and scholarships to pay for college. The program, affiliated with AmeriCorps, provides a multi-layered support structure with special attention paid to training and reflection among these student leaders.

The Washington Center Program

The Washington Center (TWC) provides selected students challenging opportunities to work and learn in Washington, D.C. for academic credit. TWC's mission is to prepare college and university students for civic leadership through experiential education, promoting future leadership for the public, private and nonprofit sectors of society.
