- Opportunity to earn academic credit while abroad


Why Study Abroad?

Models for Faculty-Led Programs





Models for Faculty-Led Programs (Continued)


Program Length and Scheduling:

- Spring break & late Spring (May) are typically 7 to 14 days of travel
- Summer course programs are typically 2 to 4 weeks of travel
- Spring faculty-led programs: no extra tuition costs for students who stay within 12-18 credits
- Option 1: Spring break travel within full semester course, or within 8-week course (staring in March)
- Option 2: An 8-week Spring course, starting in March, with INC grades and late May travel



Faculty Costs For Faculty-Led Programs

As faculty members leading a faculty-led program, you will not be responsible for most costs associated with your travel. The majority of the costs are covered by program fees paid by students.



<u>Airfare</u>

Roundtrip airfare is built into the program budget and paid for by students



Faculty Housing

Lodging in a single room is built into your program, usually a stay at the hotel or similar accommodation with the students.



Faculty Per Diems

Faculty per diems (State Dept rates) is paid for each day spent with students



Faculty Transportation

Faculty transportation from your intitial departure until your return is included within the program.

Timeline for Faculty-Led Program

• Pricing finalized for Summer standalone programs

 IAI sends proposals to respective Dean, with our analysis of: risk management (safety, health) duplication of destinations, duplication of topics Enrollment potential, feedback on programs competing for similar student populations 	March 1, 2024
 IAI contacts proposers with updates: Approved to run as is. Will be blended with another course (shared itinerary) Is approved to run in an alternate time slot. Not approved. 	March 15, 2024
 Proposers submit Contact Hours form, Faculty Leader Agreement IAI and proposers work together on program design and pricing with Study Abroad Association, FOS Tours, or Worldstrides 	April - August, 2024
 Pricing finalized for J-Term, Spring break, and if possible all late Spring programs (travel in May). Publish and recruit. 	September 1st, 2024

Funding Opportunities for Students



S.O.A.R. Scholarships (Study abroad

Opportunity and Access Resources)

- New scholarships that were first offered for the Spring 2023 semester with Provost's Office funding
- Designated for students with demonstrated financial need
- \$1,500 scholarships for Faculty-Led programs
- Deadlines: Oct 1, 2024 for J-Term & Spring 2025 programs
- Feb 1, 2025 for Summer standalone programs

Gilman Scholarships

- No minimum program length requirement
- Student must be a Pell Grant recipient
- Deadline will be: October 1 2024 for J-Term and Spring 2025
 programs / March 1 2025 for Summer 2025

Helpful Hints



- Consider proposals that align with IAI goals:
 - Expand programs to include a wider
 variety of destination countries & regions
 - Offer programs grounded in a wider variety of academic disciplines
- Propose a program that includes aspects/components that can not be carried out on-campus
- The course offered should fulfill a Major,
 Minor or Gen Ed requirement
- Make sure that prerequisites do not limit the pool of prospective applicants too much
