Jean Alvares:

Wanted to comment regarding student Sense of Belonging - Does a discussion board with students every semester for years... Students feel forced to come to college. Students feel a lack of support from peers and are afraid to ask questions. Students like to hear that a professor acknowledges that higher education is messed up.

Provost:

Wanted to clarify - He asked the Foundation Board for \$250K for Study Abroad Experience and \$150K for undergraduate research opportunities.

Arnold Korotkin:

Asking about Covid University Policies and Procedures. Discussed a specific issue in his class and he will follow up with the Dean of Students office.

Dawn Soufleris:

There have been about 3 or 4 incidents where students, and some non-students, in academic buildings have come into a classroom with Nerf guns or water pellet guns, or entered hallways with fake guns. These are cases related to Tiktok and social media challenges. Students and non-students are trying to replicate the challenges they see on social media, so they can post it. No one was harmed because of it, but some people were alarmed. Police are investigating and appropriate action is being taken.

Bill Sullivan:

What percent of students, faculty and staff respond to HawkCheck on a daily basis?

Dawn Soufleris:

Does not have that information but HR does. Over the last month, student response has been low.

Tim Gorman:

Given these incidents and what is going on in the world. Do we have any active shooter training/drills coming?

Dawn Soufleris:

Good question, we will be having a drill in March during spring break. Certain people will be involved in particular law enforcement, and our Incident Managers. That will start sparking the opportunity for others to be trained, and information going out to the community. We look to establish some training for all of us to have in the event of an emergency. It is on the radar.

David Trubach:

Asked if there are any food service contract updates?

Dawn Soufleris: The process is closed. Looking through proposals.

Provost: No. The short answer is no updates right now.
