
Of the more than 20,000 students who will submit applications this year, you have been invited to join a community of scholars — past and present — who call Montclair State home.

GETTING STARTED — To help you navigate the enrollment process, we've prepared the following checklist:

☐ 1. KNOW YOUR CAMPUS-WIDE ID (CWID) AND PIN

Your Campus-Wide ID (CWID) and PIN are your keys to becoming a Montclair State student. These were assigned to you when you were accepted to the University. You will find your CWID and PIN in your acceptance letter. You will use the CWID and PIN to take the next step: submitting your New Student Deposit. If you misplace your CWID and PIN, please contact the Office of Undergraduate Admissions at **973-655-4444** or **msuadm@mail.montclair.edu** for assistance.

□ 2. LET US KNOW YOU'RE COMMITTING TO MONTCLAIR STATE

To reserve your place at Montclair State, simply submit your **New Student Deposit*** payment online at **montclair.edu/admissions/deposit**.

If you are planning to live on campus, you may also submit your **Housing Deposit*** at this time. Once your New Student Deposit and Housing Deposit are processed, you may complete the online **Housing Application** in mid-April. Go to **montclair.edu/residence-life** and select "Housing Assignments" from the top navigation tabs to access the application.

*May 1, 2017, is the final deadline for the New Student Deposit and Housing Deposit. The New Student Deposit and Housing Deposit are non-refundable. Montclair State is one of the country's top 30 LGBTQ-friendly colleges and universities, noted for its "Best of the Best" LGBTQ-friendly policies, programs and practices, according to Campus Pride.

☐ 3. OBTAIN YOUR NetID

Your NetID is your Montclair State email account login ID and your ID for other web-based University systems. You will receive an email with instructions once your New Student Deposit is processed. Establish (claim) your NetID by visiting **netid.montclair.edu**. Please note, your NetID cannot be claimed until you submit your New Student Deposit.

□ 4. COMPLETE MANDATORY HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

The University Health Center — **montclair.edu/university-health-center** — oversees all mandatory health requirements for student enrollment. As part of your enrollment at Montclair State, you will need to:

- Download and print the immunization forms from the University Health Center website: montclair.edu/university-health-center/immunizations.
- Have your health care provider complete and sign the forms. (Records from your high school or another university may be submitted in place of these forms.)
- Enter your immunization record information from the forms into the online **My Health** application at **montclair.edu/university-health-center/my-health** and click submit.
- MAIL THE COMPLETED AND SIGNED FORMS TO:

Students are not compliant until the immunization record information is submitted online, the actual forms are received by the University Health Center and the information is validated.

Assure adequate health insurance coverage. All full-time Montclair State students are required to have health insurance coverage. Montclair State will automatically enroll you in the Student Health Insurance Plan provided through the University. If you have private health insurance coverage, you must waive this enrollment by showing proof of other insurance. You can waive the enrollment and health insurance premium fee by going to firststudent.com and completing the waiver process. ENROLLMENT CHECKLIST

□ 5. REGISTER FOR PLACEMENT TESTING

All first-year students need to complete the appropriate placement testing — or receive exemption — prior to registering for coursework. Taking the **Montclair** State University Placement Test (MSUPT) allows us to assess your current level of academic preparedness. Montclair State administers the Accuplacer for a placement test in reading and mathematics. Students whose majors require General Chemistry I must also take the Chemistry Readiness Test.

Complete and submit the online Placement Test Reply Form found at montclair.edu/ academic-assessment. From this page, click the "Assessment & Testing" tab in the left navigation to review the criteria and policy for testing (or exemption from testing) and to complete and submit the form. It is important to note that if, after taking the reading portion of the MSUPT, it is determined that you need further remediation, you will have to complete the required remedial reading course. The remedial reading course must be taken in the summer prior to fall entry or the winter prior to spring entry. Students who are required to complete the remedial reading course will not be able to enroll in classes until the class is completed. More information about our reading remediation policy can be found on the academic assessment website listed above. This supports your best start possible at Montclair State.

Incoming first-year students may also need to take a foreign language placement test. Visit **flp.montclair.edu** to view the requirements and register for the placement test, if required.

☐ 6. ATTEND ORIENTATION

The Office of Academic Success and Retention Programs (ASRP) coordinates all of Montclair State's orientation programs. All new students must attend a MANDATORY orientation session. Register for the orientation experience designed to support your introduction to the University.

All incoming first-year students must register for the Montclair State Orientation Experience. Go to montclair.edu/undergraduate-orientation to register online. For more information, please call the Office of Academic Success and Retention Programs at 973-655-4162.

☐ 7. SUBMIT YOUR FINAL TRANSCRIPTS

Your final high school transcripts (with graduation date) and AP and CLEP scores must be sent to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions.

- 3) Complete the Residence License and Dining Agreement and Housing Preferences survey by June 1, 2017. Go to montclair.edu/residence-life and click on "Housing Assignments" from the top navigation tab to access the online application. Note: This survey will become available in mid-April.


UNIVERSITY HALL CAFÉ


CAREER SERVICES

More than 75 percent of Montclair State University students receive some form of grants, loans and/or scholarships.

We know that financing your education can be a primary concern. That's why we're proud that Montclair State is able to provide a quality education at an affordable price. A number of financial aid options — including loans, scholarships, grants and work-study programs — are available to help pay for your Montclair State education. It's easy to apply for financial aid — just complete and submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) by March 15, 2017, or update your FAFSA to include Montclair State.

CALCULATE YOUR COSTS

Trying to get a handle on exactly how much college is going to cost? Check out our Net Price Calculator. It's easy — simply enter the details of when you plan to attend, the number of credit hours you will take, where you will live and the financial awards you expect to receive. Then let the calculator do the rest. It can also direct you to other sources of financial aid and student loans.

THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT FINANCIAL AID:

1. YOU'LL NEVER KNOW IF YOU'RE **ELIGIBLE FOR FINANCIAL AID UNLESS YOU APPLY!**

Fill out the FAFSA at **fafsa.ed.gov** to see if you qualify for federal aid. Check back 48 hours after you complete the form to make sure it processed completely.

2. YOU MAY BE ELIGIBLE FOR STATE AID.

After you complete the FAFSA, you'll receive a confirmation page with a link to a form that will help the State of New Jersey determine if you're eligible for additional aid. Missed the form? You can visit **hesaa.org** five business days after you complete the FAFSA to find and complete the state form.

3. CHECK YOUR MONTCLAIR STATE **ACCOUNTS OFTEN.**

Your Montclair State email and student accounts will contain a wealth of information about your financial aid package. If you don't check these accounts regularly, you may miss important information that could delay your financial aid disbursement. Most of the tasks related to financial aid need to be completed over the summer months log on regularly to see if anything is waiting for you.

If you are alerted that more information is needed, be sure to submit the additional paperwork as soon as possible. The sooner we hear from you, the sooner we can get you your financial award information. If you have questions about financial aid, call or email financialaid@mail.montclair.edu now.

5. MAKE A PLAN.

Financial aid helps pay your bills, but in many cases it won't cover all costs. To get your plan started, log in to your student account and review the estimated cost of attendance. (This is an estimate — not your actual bill.) Then, review your payment options. You can set up a payment plan with the Office of Student Accounts or pursue private loans to cover any differences. Should you seek a private loan, remember that they can take six to eight weeks to process.

A college degree is a great investment. Employees with bachelor's degrees make \$1 million more than high school graduates over the course of their lifetime, according to U.S. Census Bureau estimates.
