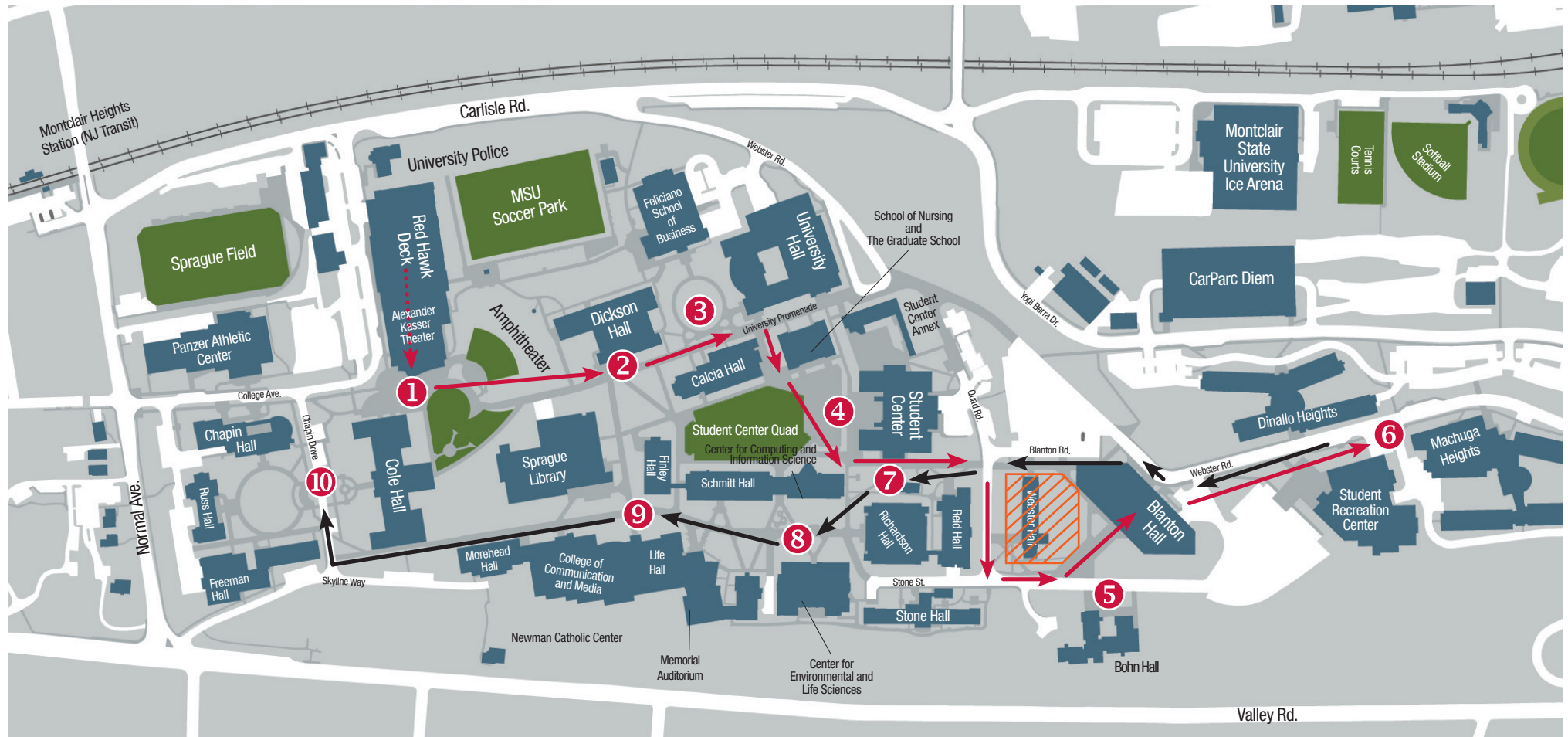

STOP 1

Amphitheater and Alexander Kasser Theater

Kasser Theater offers student shows, Peak Performances and off-Broadway shows, and an open-air amphitheater is right next door.

Red Hawk Parking Deck and George Segal Gallery

A visitor parking deck with the George Segal Gallery located on the fourth floor. The gallery, named after the renowned sculptor, presents exhibits throughout the academic year.

University Police Department

A fully certified and operational law enforcement agency, the University Police Department serves the Montclair community. The University Police and EMS are always available by phone at 973-655-5222. With an Emergency Blue Light system and Rave Guardian, a student will never feel unsafe or alone on campus at any time. Family members and guests can join the emergency alert system by texting "montclairstatealerts" to 226787.

Sprague Field

Home to many Red Hawks NCAA sports teams including football, field hockey and lacrosse.

Panzer Athletic Center

With three gymnasiums, an Olympic-sized swimming pool and fitness center, this athletic center houses the 18 NCAA Division III teams on campus.

Cole Hall – Red Hawk Central

First and only building on campus when the University opened in 1908 as the New Jersey State Normal School at Montclair. Home of Red Hawk Central, and central location for all student services including: Undergraduate Admissions, Financial Aid, Student Accounts, Honors Program, President's Office, Disability Resource Center and more.

STOP 2

Dickson Hall

The College of Humanities and Social Sciences houses programs like: Anthropology, English, Philosophy, Languages and many more.

STOP 3

Feliciano School of Business

The Feliciano School of Business is accredited by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB) International, the highest accreditation for business schools worldwide. The School contains the Feliciano Center for Entrepreneurship, a lecture hall, study rooms, a MIX Lab with 3D printers and a trading floor. A new addition to the building is Saxby's, a student-run cafe that serves coffee, smoothies and delicious light bites.

University Hall

The College for Community Health contains several departments like Exercise Science, Nutrition, Family Science and Human Development, and more. The College for Education and Engaged Learning houses Teacher Education and Educational Foundations.

The School of Nursing and The Graduate School

The School of Nursing offers RN to BSN, 4-year BSN and new online MSN degrees. The facility contains a simulation center with high fidelity manikins, health care labs and much more. The Graduate School is also located here.

Calcia Hall

Main facility for the Art and Design department of the College of the Arts. It contains fine arts specialization studios for drawing, sculpture, ceramics, jewelry-making, photography and more.

STOP 4

Student Center

With over 150+ student organizations, the main hub for student activity is here. Inside is the student café, Student Government Association, the University Bookstore, ID Card Office, an Information Help Desk and Red Hawk Nest for students to relax.

STOP 5

Blanton Hall

Housing all level students with a suite-style design accommodating 2-3 roommates per room, connected by a single bathroom. The main atrium contains eateries such as Dunkin'

Donuts, La Cantina and a virtual kitchen serving Jersey Mike's, Smash N Go and more!

Student Health Center

The SHC offers physicals, medical screenings, diagnosis and treatment, and on-site prescription medication for all students.

Bohn Hall

More than 600 freshman students are housed in this community style residence hall. Attached to the building is the Center for Writing Excellence to assist students with any writing needs.

Stone Hall

A new residence hall designed in a community style for freshman students.

STOP 6

The Heights Complex

Dinallo and Machuga Heights house over 2,000 students of all levels. The rooms offer two living styles, either double or single style which is one open floor plan or one room broken into two smaller suites. Each style has its own bathroom and temperature control. The complexes have lounges, community kitchens and game rooms.

Sam's Place – Machuga Heights

A buffet-style dining area set up with vegetarian, vegan and allergen-free options. Attached to Sam's Place is Yella's, a day and late-night eatery.

Student Recreation Center

This center is open to all students free of charge. Containing multiple floors and activities such as free weights, swimming pool, racquetball courts, basketball courts, indoor track, game area, equipment rental, club/recreational sports, Group X classes, personal trainers, cardio equipment and free lockers. Fun fact: Actress Florence Pugh swam at the pool for a scene in the movie *A Good Person*!

STOP 7

Drop-In Center – Health Promotion

Health Promotion provides education, outreach and advocacy to enhance the health of all students, faculty and staff.

Reid Hall

Home to research and teaching labs for the Department of Biology. Built to resemble the layout of a hospital for a life-like educational setting.

Richardson Hall

Home to the College of Science and Mathematics' research facilities and programs that sustain and grow high-demand science programs. Included are classrooms, research labs, teaching labs and instructional facilities.

STOP 8

Center for Environmental and Life Sciences

Home to Earth and Environmental Studies and many other programs, the Center features Electron Microscopy and Geographic Information Labs, with a beautiful NYC skyline view. The building is also LEED certified which ensures electricity cost savings, lower carbon emissions and healthier environments for students, faculty and staff.

Center for Computing and Information Science, Schmitt Hall, Finley Hall

Three interconnected buildings that are home to Computer Science programs, language and math labs, testing centers, Modern Languages and Literatures, and Spanish and Latino Studies.

Memorial Auditorium

One of three auditoriums on campus, Memorial Auditorium can seat 1,000 and hosts many events, recitals, concerts and other student activities.

STOP 9

Life Hall

Home to the Department of Theatre and Dance, Life Hall features a dance studio and small black-box theater.

College of Communication and Media

Home to programs like Communication Studies, Journalism, Television Production and more. Facilities include a 175-seat presentation hall, 4K control rooms, Foley stage production and more.

Morehead Hall

Offices for the College of the Arts and School of Communication and Media and student lounges are located here.

Sprague Library

A three-floor library with over 1 million books, periodicals and documents, and laptop lending.

STOP 10

Chapin Hall

Home to the John J. Cali School of Music, this building houses all music programs such as Music, Music Therapy/Performance and Music Education. The Jed Leshowitz Recital Hall and sound-proof rehearsal rooms are located here as well.

Freeman Hall and Russ Hall

A complex of two suite style residence halls with an all-you-can-eat dining hall in the middle. Housing all level students, there are double-occupancy rooms that are connected by a conjoining bathroom for each suite.
