Matters Presented by the Chair — Mr. Hiltzik

Mr. Hiltzik welcomed Mr. Council to the Board and introduced Prof. Sandra Adams of the Biology & Molecular Biology Department as the new Faculty Representative to the Board of Trustees. Mr. Hiltzik reported in closed session the Trustees reviewed the minutes from April 15, 2016, received an update on legal matters, and discussed presidential compensation. The Board also received a copy of the Clery report for April and May 2016. The report will be appended to the minutes and made a part of the permanent record.

Matters Presented by the President - Dr. Susan A. Cole

Dr. Cole reported that Commencement had taken place the prior week and the University had its largest graduating class in history, conferring 3,379 bachelor's degree, 1,231 master's degree and 29 doctoral degrees. The Honorary degree recipient was Don Garber, Commissioner of Major League Soccer. Distinguished alumni awards were given during the respective College's Convocation to the following: College of the Arts – Tony Award Winning Actress Melba Moore ('70), College of Humanities and Social Sciences (Humanities) – Angelo Genova, Esq. ('75), (Social Sciences) – Nader Tavakoli ('80), College of Science and Math - Ralph R. Miano ('58), College of Education and Human Services - Arlene Crescenzi Allen ('64), Feliciano School of Business - Constantino "Gus" Milano ('81), and the Graduate School - Crystal Kuykendall ('72). Dr. Cole introduced the founding Dean of the School of Nursing, Dr. Janice Smolowitz. Dr. Cole reported that the University had concluded negotiations to have the Red Bulls II begin playing home games at Pittser Field in 2017. In return, the Red Bulls have agreed to increase stadium seating at Pittser field and add amenities such as a locker room and ticket booth. The University's relationship with Sony is beginning to be realized as the new School of Communications and Media construction moves forward on budget and on pace to open as scheduled in January 2017.

Union Report

Professor Richard Wolfson congratulated newly elected University Senate President David Trubatch. Professor Wolfson stated he looked forward to welcoming the new faculty in the Fall, and congratulated the professional staff appointed to 4 and 5 year contracts as well as those faculty receiving promotions. Professor Wolfson questioned the change in University policy regarding faculty use of Apple computers versus windows based desktop computers. The Union does not take exception with the proposed managerial salary adjustment pool, but rather, Profession Wolfson asked the Board of Trustees to advocate on behalf of the Union for its salary increases. Professor Wolfson then introduced Robert Neuman, the new President of Local 6025, which represents adjunct faculty and asked the Board to consider pay equity for adjunct faculty members.

FY 2017 Managerial Salary Program

Mr. Hiltzik moved that the Board of Trustees, to accommodate salary increases for individual managers effective July 1, 2016, authorize the President to make available an overall pool of dollars not to exceed 4.0% of the total for FY16 managerial salaries. Individual salary increases shall be based on merit and market conditions. The motion was seconded and approved unanimously.

Presidential Compensation

In recognition of the President's continuing outstanding performance, accomplishments and service to the University, Mr. Hiltzik moved that the Board of Trustees approve, effective July 1, 2016, a salary increase to \$420,000, that is, approximately 4%, and a performance bonus equal to 10% of her current salary. Mr. Kennedy recused himself from this matter. The motion was seconded and approved unanimously with the noted recusal.
