MATTERS PRESENTED BY THE CHAIR – MR. KENT SLUYTER

Mr. Sluyter reported that in Closed Session, the Trustees reviewed the minutes from the July 2025 committee meetings, reviewed Committee reports, and reviewed the legal matters report.

MATTERS PRESENTED BY THE PRESIDENT

President Koppell welcomed back students for the start of the semester and noted the successful student orientations, move-in and welcome week on both Montclair and Bloomfield campuses. President Koppell highlighted the record enrollment of 24,000 students and improved retention and graduation rates. He also addressed the success of Montclair Unbound and Summer Pre-College Programs and the PROPEL Project, which provides opportunities to managers and administrators to enhance their professional skills. The President spotlighted the creation of the Montclair 250 committee to celebrate the country's semiquincentennial milestone and the series of community lectures around American democracy and civic engagement which will take place throughout the academic year. He also commented on the increased national visibility of the University. President Koppell ended by thanking Provost Junius Gonzales for his work at the University and wishing well in his new role.

UNION REPORT

AFT President Laura Field welcomed faculty and staff back to campus and noted the AFT's continued commitment to supporting its members through the current challenging higher education landscape. President Field acknowledged the beginning of Hispanic Serving Institutions Week and looked forward to celebrating the rich diversity of the University throughout the coming week and months. She also noted that in light of the leadership changes and restructuring at the University, the AFT stands ready to work with the administration and negotiate impacts when appropriate to support the University into the future. President Field closed by encouraging all to stay engaged in the local and gubernatorial elections in November.
