Human Rights Interns:

- Study and learn about human rights law and history.
- Conduct in-depth, academic research on a specific human rights topic.
- Complete training in human rights education pedagogy and curriculum development.
- Develop a lesson plan for a K-12 classroom on your topic.
- Visit a local school and teach your lesson.
- Publish your lesson online.

Requirements:

- All Montclair undergraduate students may apply for the internship.
- Identify a human rights topic that matters to you.
- Accepted interns must take EDFD 445 Human Rights Education, Mon. & Thurs. 12:45-2:00pm. You will earn 3 credits for the internship.

Sample topics: Black Lives Matter, Disability Rights, Antisemitism, Environmental Justice, Native American rights, Latinx history, DACA & Dreamers, Reproductive Health Care, Mental Health Disparities, Housing or Food Insecurity, Educational Equality, etc.
