

#### **CREATIVE TEAM**

Anna Rebek (Director)

Anna Rebek is a Mexican and Hungarian-American opera and theater director working in NYC. Anna received her BFA from Yale University in acting, then moved to NYC in 2017 to get her MFA at Columbia in Anne Bogart's prestigious directing program, exploring Chekhov's Uncle Vanya, Peter Weiss' Marat Sade, Shakespeare's The Tempest, and King Lear.

In 2020, Anna was awarded the Opera Directing Fellowship at Juilliard and studied with Stephen Wadsworth and Mary Birnbaum. In 2021 she was elevated to assistant faculty status, teaching acting to Juilliard's most advanced singers.

While at Juilliard, Anna assisted on Donizetti's L'elisir D'amore, Stravinsky's The Rake's Progress, Nicolai's Die Lustigen Weiber von Windsor, and Rossi's L'Orfeo. As an AD, she was entrusted with helping individual singers advance their physical presence on stage. Anna's favorite opera directing credits include Mozart's Le Nozze di Figaro in the historic Estates Theater in Prague, Puccini's La Bohème at Soo Opera in Michigan, and Monteverdi's Vespers of 1610 dedicated to La Virgen de Guadalupe at Co-cathedral in Brooklyn.

At Montclair State University this fall, Anna established a rigorous work ethic in her Opera Workshop class. Using techniques ranging from Anne Bogart's Viewpoints to working in neutral masks, the group explored the possibilities of movement and gesture and formed a cohesive ensemble. Anna would like to thank her family, Isaac Beauchamp, DB, her mentors, Lori McCann, Beth Roberts, Jeffrey Gall, Victoria Schwartzman, William Hobbs, Kyle Ritenauer, Heather Freedman, Maamoun Tobbo and Karen Driscoll for their support throughout this process. Toi toi to the fabulous cast of *Gianni Schicchi* and *Buoso's Ghost* for their incredible work.

New York City-based conductor **Kyle Ritenauer** is a rising presence in the classical music world. On faculty at the Manhattan School of Music, Kyle

regularly conducts the school's chamber ensemble Camerata Nova, leads the school's Winds, Brass, Percussion Orchestra Training Program, conducts the Composers Orchestra, rehearses the Philharmonia and Symphony Orchestras, and serves as the 5th Director of the MSM Percussion Ensemble in its 63 years of existence. This season Kyle will work with the National Symphony Orchestra, Symphony New Hampshire, NYC's Camerata Notturna, and the Elgin Symphony Orchestra, where he is a finalist for Music Director. He will also be making his operatic debut this winter leading a double bill performance of Puccini's Gianni Schicchi, and Michael Ching's Buoso's Ghost.

Throughout his career, Kyle has appeared as guest conductor with Symphony New Hampshire, the Norwalk Symphony, the Hudson Valley Philharmonic, the Elgin Symphony Orchestra, and Carnegie Hall's Ensemble Connect. In the role of assistant conductor, Ritenauer has worked with the National Symphony Orchestra, the St. Louis Symphony Orchestra, Opera de Montreal, Orchestre Métropolitain (Montreal), the Des Moines Metro Opera, the Utah Symphony, the New Jersey Symphony Orchestra, and the Detroit Symphony Orchestra.

Kyle is a graduate of The Juilliard School's Orchestral Conducting Program as a student of Maestro David Robertson.

Born in St. Petersburg, Russia, Victoria Schwartzman (Music Director and Repetiteur) performs regularly as a soloist and chamber musician. Victoria has appeared at the Music Mountain Festival, in the New York Philharmonic Ensembles series at Merkin Hall, at Summit Music Festival with Dmitri Berlinsky, at Bargemusic, in the Gessner- Schocken concert series in Cambridge, WMP Concert Hall, and the Nicolas Roerich Museum concert series in New York City. After graduating from Jerusalem Conservatory, Victoria continued her education at the Longy School of Music and New England Conservatory. While pursuing various degrees in solo and chamber music performance, she was selected to perform in masterclasses given by Dmitri Bashkirov, Menahem Pressler, and Richard Goode, among others. Her principal teachers include Irina Kivaiko, Issak Kossov,

Victor Rosenbaum, Sally Pinkas, Eda Shlyam, and Eteri Andjaparidze.

As a soloist with orchestra, Victoria has performed with the Jerusalem Chamber Orchestra, the Longy School of Music Chamber Orchestra, the Riverside Orchestra, and the Greater Newburgh Symphony Orchestra. She has performed at the Quartet Program in Pennsylvania and participated in the Tel-Hai International Piano Festival in Israel and the Lyrica Chamber Music Festival in New Jersey. She is on the coaching faculty in the Vocal Department at Montclair State University and Long Island University Post as well as on the piano faculty at the Bard College Conservatory Preparatory division. Victoria is also the co-founder of the Newburgh Music Festival, a weeklong immersive classical music program devoted to both solo performance and chamber music, located on the shore of the Hudson River, in Newburgh, NY.

Born in Austin, Texas, William Hobbs (Assistant Conductor and Repetiteur) received his Bachelor's degree in Piano Performance summa cum laude from the University of Colorado at Boulder, and a Master of Music in Piano Performance, Research and Literature from the Eastman School of Music in Rochester, New York. As soloist, Mr. Hobbs was featured with orchestras and ensembles such as the Gulbenkian Foundation Orchestra in Lisbon, Portugal (Mozart) and the University of Colorado Wind Ensemble (Stravinsky, Messiaen). As recitalist, he has been featured in festivals like the Hamptons Music Festival (Southampton NY) and the Chester Music Festival (Chester, England). He has performed full and partial recitals in over a dozen countries, including the United States, England, Korea, France, Greece, Italy, Spain, Malta, Poland and others. As chamber musician, he has collaborated with many of today's top performers. including Yo- Yo Ma, Ida Kavafian, James Galway, and many others. As collaborative pianist and conductor, Mr. Hobbs works at many of the world's major opera houses, including the Opéra National de Paris, the Salzburg Festival, San Francisco Opera, Chicago Lyric Opera, Seattle Opera, Washington Opera and the Opéra de Monte- Carlo. Mr. Hobbs joined the Piano and Voice Faculty at Westminster Choir College in Princeton, New Jersey in Fall 2010. He joined the Vocal

Arts Faculty of the Juilliard School of Music in 2014. He is currently teaching at the Graduate Center of the City University of New York, the John J. Cali School of Music at Montclair State University (Montclair, New Jersey), and the Peabody Institute (Baltimore, Maryland). Mr. Hobbs can be heard in recordings of music by Lowell Liebermann, Xavier Montsalvage, and Dave Soldier, Christos Hatzis, and Kaikhosru Sorabji. He served as Music Director for the Opera America Songbook, which celebrated the opening of the National Opera Center in New York City. He also was the Producer for a recording of songs by Ricky Ian Gordon for Bright Shiny Things recordings, with soprano Jennifer Zetlan and the composer at the piano.

Karen Driscoll (Head of Artistic Operations/Opera) is an Adjunct professor of Voice and an opera director at John J. Cali School of Music. Most recently, she directed the fall chamber opera, The Beautiful Bridegroom, by Dan Shore. She has led multiple scenes programs for MSU's Opera Workshop classes, as well as role preparation productions including Sweeney Todd and La Bohème. She has also enjoyed collaborating on many occasions as not only a soprano soloist with MSU Singers and Chorale choirs but also as director of Considering Matthew Shepard. As a soprano soloist, Ms. Driscoll has sung leading roles with Seattle Opera, Florida Grand Opera, Florentine Opera, L'Opéra de Montréal, Vancouver Opera, Virginia Opera, Baltimore Opera, Lyric Opera of Kansas City, National Lyric Opera, Michigan Opera Theatre, Opera Columbus, Toledo Opera, Opera Carolina, Hawaii Opera Theater, New Jersey State Opera, Palm Beach Opera, Long Beach Opera, Worcester Chorus and Masterwork Chorus to name a few. She is a native of Ohio where she began her music studies at the University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music and also where she holds a Bachelor of Music in Music Education and Master of Music Degree in Vocal Performance.

Phil Clifford (Production Manager) has worked extensively in the live concert industry as a production manager and has toured the United States as an audio engineer for many artists and productions. He has worked directly with such artists as Aretha Franklin, Béla Fleck, Todd Rundgren and many others. At the Cali School, Phil manages day to day operations,

directly oversees all concert and recital activities, and teaches courses for the recording arts and production degree program.

Maamoun Tobbo (Scenic Designer) is a Lebanese theater maker based in New York City who is equally at home in the worlds of Theater, Film, and Performing Arts. He graduated from NYU Tisch School of the Arts with an MFA in Theatre and Film Design. Since then he has assisted well accredited designers, such as Clint Ramos and Jacob a Climer, and designed sets at NYU, Baltimore center stage, Rattlestick Theatre, 59E59, and Yale University. Maamoun has also directed several plays such as "War on Drugs" for Global Forms Theater Festival; "Play", a devised work at Tanthem's "La nuit de l'art festival"; and "The Aliens Make Thanksgiving Dinner" at Rattlestick Theatre.

Jeffrey Rosolen (Technical Director) is a freelance Production/Event Manager, Scenic Carpenter, and Owner of The Rose Hammer a woodworking company specializing in sustainable cutting boards.

Benjamin Weill (Lighting Designer) is a NYC based lighting designer. He has received the BroadwayWorld-New Jersey award for Best Lighting Design of a Musical. He is back for his seventh year designing the Cali School Opera. Maggie Raywood (Costume Production Assistant) joined the NYU Design Department faculty in 1992. Employed in the professional theater since 1975, she has been a draper and costume shop manager on Broadway shows, opera, and dance, in NYC costume shops as well as regional and international theaters. She has designed costumes for contemporary dance companies, for Pan Asian Repertory Company, and for eight summers of productions as part of The Season, NYU's program of summer performances at Villa La Pietra in Florence, Italy. At Villa La Pietra she is engaged in research into the collection of early 20th Century Callot Soeurs gowns housed in the Acton Collection.

Mitchell Hildebrand (Stage Manager) is a freelance stage manager who has a BFA in Theatre Production and Design with a concentration in Stage Management from Montclair State University.
