

Tanya Dusevic Witek is Adjunct Professor of Flute at the John J. Cali School of Music at Montclair State University. She is a member of the New York City Ballet Orchestra, American Ballet Theater, Festival Orchestra of Lincoln Center and Orchestra of St. Luke's, and has also performed with the Metropolitan Opera, New York Philharmonic, New Jersey Symphony, Orpheus and Musicians from Marlboro.
