How Are Classes Being Offered in Spring 2021?

Your instructor will adhere to the format listed as a requirement for the course. If you prefer a different format, you should select another section or course. Your academic advisor can help you determine the best plan for your success. Make an appointment with them on Navigate.

WHAT DOES THAT MEAN?

- Modality: Teaching method; how class is being offered
- Synchronous: Happens at the time class is scheduled on NEST
- Asynchronous: Happens at no set scheduled time; whenever
- Simultaneosly: At the same time

Hawk2Hawk (H2H)

Class meets as scheduled on NEST in person with all students enrolled in the course.

Face coverings must be worn in classrooms.

Appropriate social distancing measures outlined by the University will be in place.

HawkLIVE (HLV)

Class meets face-to-face and streams online simultaneously (students will rotate in-person instruction throughout the semester).

Example:

- Outside of class: readings/videos, writing
- In-person/online: peer review and discussion(s)

HawkMIX (HMX)

Class is offered online (either synchronously or asynchronously) with **group** activities meeting in person.

Example:

• Online lectures with inperson lab activities

Check NEST for the number of hours you will spend in the classroom.

HawkFIELD (FLD)

Professional activities to be conducted at a placement site.

Additional class meetings may be offered **online or in person.**

Examples:

- Internship
- Externship
- Co-operative Experience
- Clinical Rotation
- Practicum

HawkSYNC Online (SON)

There is **no face-to-face** instruction.

You will attend live online class sessions.

HawkASYNC Online (AON)

There is no face-to-face instruction.

You will complete work on your own by stated deadlines.
